






Fatal/Serious Crashes

Many of the region's fatal and serious injury crashes occur on higher speed arterial roadways, especially at intersections.



TOTAL FATAL CRASHES: 834 TOTAL SERIOUS INJURY CRASHES: 2,699

TOTAL PEDESTRIAN INVOLVED CRASHES: 3,832 TOTAL BICYCLIST INVOLVED CRASHES: 1,689



MULTIMODAL



There are 867 miles of bike lanes, paved paths, and shared roadways (bike routes) throughout the region.

399 of those miles are considered "high comfort facilities" which are appropriate for all ages and abilities.















Equity

RTC connects people to opportunities by funding infrastructure and operating services that strive to meet a wide range of transportation needs. The community we serve includes people with low incomes, historically underserved or disinvested neighborhoods, older adults, youth, and people who have different physical or cognitive abilities.

To serve all people, RTC focuses on:

Engagement – Promoting participation from across our diverse community, with a goal of increasing participation by people who have traditionally been underserved or overburdened by transportation infrastructure.

Access – Expanding access to jobs, training, schools, health care, and other key services for people with fewer transportation or mobility options.

Investment – Funding and advocating for transportation improvements that increase safety, economic mobility, and overall quality of life for residents with the greatest needs.
